Friends, please join us for this most holy season of our faith. Allow the Spirit of God to open you to the newness of the Resurrection. I'm excited about what God is doing through the ministries of Main Street UMC. Thanks be to God that we are "Gathered Up in Jesus."

Main Street UMC's Community
Partnership with Encinal has helped to
provide ongoing services which have
benefited the community in many
ways. Main Street has provided:

- Transportation for community assessments, which provide key demographic information and also help community leaders determine and prioritize needs,
- Transportation for the delivery of preventative health supplies such as COVID-19 Hygiene Kits (hand sanitizer,

sanitation spray, masks, educational brochure, etc.), which were delivered twice in 2021,

- Communication through regular telephone calls offering support, advocacy, and guidance,
- Continued educational support for community leaders and community health volunteers through bi-monthly contacts, distribution of materials, and video support,
- Advanced communication resource tools needed for FOB medical staff to provide weekly telemedicine support at various levels, and
- Emergency support for families suffering loss.

Main Street UMC's impact was significant in Encinol. Continued contact, support, education, and preventative measures were essential to staying healthy in 2021. The community even remarked that they were so blessed to have not been forgotten.




#### CHILDREN AND YOUTH MINISTRIES


