Dear Friends,

There are several things about February that make it great. It is usually Super Bowl month, which is the biggest football game of the year. After many regular season games and a round of playoff games, it comes down to one final game to determine the best football team in all the world. It has become known among nonfootball fans by its halftime show and commercials. Some of the biggest names in entertainment treat the fans and watchers at home to a "Vegas-type" halftime show, and the biggest companies in the world come up with the most interesting ways to present their product in new, never before seen commercials.

Not only is there the "Big Game" in February, but we also celebrate Black History Month where we take time to recognize and celebrate the significant contributions made by African Americans who have molded our Nation. We remember the tremendous impact Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. had on the Civil Rights movement and the creations of more just laws in this country. We remember Rosa Parks, known for refusing to give her seat on a bus to a white person. She is remembered as the "Mother of the Freedom Movement" following her bold disobedience and subsequent arrest. Also, the acknowledgement of sports figures like

Jackie Robinson who was the first African American to play for a major league baseball team. This was the catalyst that broke baseball's color barrier — the idea that African American players couldn't play in the top professional leagues, but only in the "inferior" Negro leagues. These heroes helped shaped our nation and laid the ground work for the progress still to be made.

But February is also the month of Valentine's Day. It originated as a Christian feast day honoring one or two early Christian martyrs named Saint Valentine; but it has become a cultural phenomenon known for the celebration of love. It is a holiday when we acknowledge that "special" someone in our lives. I remember in elementary school wanting to make sure my "girlfriend" got the best card in the pack bought by my mother. It has become a day of cards, flowers, balloons and chocolates. And for some, it has become a day for giving and receiving expensive jewelry.

Valentine's Day is a celebration of love, but not the Love that Paul writes about in his first letter to the church at Corinth. The love Paul writes about is not a romantic love, although it could be a part of romance. This love Paul talks about in chapter 13 of 1 Corinthians is a love in the midst of conflict and division. This sounds like the kind of love our world needs more than ever. Paul doesn't "add fuel to the fire" by talking about who is in the wrong and who is in the right. Maybe that needs to happen somewhere, somehow... But 1 Corinthians 13 is an invitation to step back from that moment. It is about reframing, about breathing, about claiming the gift that Christ came to give; it's about salvation." It's not so much that we are saved from sin, condemnation or hell, but what we are saved for, Love. This is the type of Love Paul describes in his famous "LOVE Chapter."

It is easy to read the words and quickly say, "Yes aren't they beautiful," but miss the incredible revolutionary way they change us when we can love in this way. If we fail to approach all our lives with this type of love, Paul insists we are "nothing." We can have all things, but if we do not have love, we are "nothing." This love is so many things. Read for yourself in 1 Corinthians 13. But don't just read. Let the words enter your heart, saturate your being, and become a part of you. Remember, this Love never ends, and it is the greatest of all gifts! Thanks be to God.

CHILE MISSION TRIP

"My first trip was with Walter Whitehurst, who mentored me along with his wife Betty, who also was on many trips. The first trip of about 16 was to Chile in 1992. Other



Methodist Volunteers in Mission trips were to Cuba twice, El Salvador, Mexico twice, and Zimbabwe. On those trips I rendered treatment and participated in construction when my office hours were finished; although I was on a singing choir tour with the Zimbabwe trip. Other trips were sponsored by the Methodist General Board of Global Missions to Bolivia, Guyana, and Brazil where I instructed local rural health care on local Chilean radio with me, the word workers with back care classes in basic anatomy and demonstrated exercises for back and neck pain. I have accompanied Word of Life Evangelical Church in Bedford with Pastor David Whitehurst, son of Walter and Betty, twice before, also rendering care in Chile. My last trip was with the Friends of Barnabas medical missions in 2020 where I was the first chiropractor

on any team. I would be going again with them, but I have previously committed to going to Chile, which turns out to be the exact same time. Plans for this 2022 trip with Word of Life Church are for me to treat patients, participate in services and also help with construction where needed. It is nice to go back and have familiar patients. I look forward to seeing John Elmore, our Covenant Relationship missionary, on this trip. He will be retiring at the end of April 2022 and remaining in Chile. With so many smiling faces after treatment, I am blessed knowing that the treatment that I render is not available otherwise. With literally hundreds of patients treated in the name of Jesus and activity highlighting the local Methodist church
