Dear friends,

I think of how I have come to love the people of Main Street Church. I have come to love the diversity of people that make up the congregation and the community around our church. I think that is what makes the church so special, the way people of different backgrounds are welcome and made to feel connected. Our backgrounds bring with them different ways of understanding our world and the scripture that we hold so dear. John Wesley understood this concept, and in fact in his sermon on the Catholic Spirit, Sermon #39 he said: "If thine heart is as my heart, if thou lovest God and all mankind, I ask no more: give me thine hand." He also recognized in this sermon how we as people of God can have differing views on scripture.

We don't all believe exactly the same, and there will be differences in the way we see and understand the Bible. The question is, can you live in community with people who may not "see" the way you "see", but do love God and love neighbor with all their heart, just like you. This has really been the debate in the United Methodist Church since it was formed in 1968. In 1972, exclusionary language was added to the Book of Discipline (the UMC's doctrinal Standards) to indicate "that homosexuality was incompatible with Christian teaching." Since then the church has struggled with how we can include ALL people regardless of sexual orientation. And now, this struggle has come to a head. Here is a brief, and very basic history of the last 40 months.

• In St. Louis, Missouri, February 23-26, 2019 the United Methodist Church held a special Called General Conference (the only body of the United Methodist Church that can change the Book of Discipline). Where basically two plans were considered, The One Church Plan, and Traditional Plan.

- The "Traditional Plan" was passed, in part, due to the international delegation. Meaning: our current statements about homosexuality, samesex marriage and the ordination of LGBTQ persons have not fundamentally changed. The Traditional Plan received 438 yes votes (53 percent) and 384 no votes (47 percent). Those results indicate the diversity of thought United Methodists have on these issues. This also means, it is likely there are people in our church who agree with the outcome and almost as many others who do not.
- Secondly, a disaffiliation plan, sometimes called an "exit plan," was also passed. This provides guidelines for congregations who wish to leave The United Methodist Church "for reasons of conscience" regarding issues of human sexuality.
- The One Church Plan would have kept the church from splitting, and allowed for a wider variety of beliefs around human sexuality.

Following the called General Conference, representatives from the various United Methodist groups, (Traditionalist, Centrist, and Progressives) began to meet to find a way forward in the current climate. They produced a nine-page plan, dated Dec. 17, 2019, that was mediated by Kenneth Feinberg, a well-known lawyer who oversaw the September 11th Victim Compensation Fund and other high-profile compensation programs. The plan largely focused on the distribution of financial assets. The plan was to be approved at the 2020 General Conference. However, because of the global pandemic, the 2020 General Conference was canceled.

The General Conference is an international event, and in 2020 international travel was still very complicated. It would have excluded many of the African and Asian delegates of the United Methodist Church. All of this led to the traditionalist, mostly a group known as the Wesley Covenant Association, moving forward with the formation of a new, more traditional denomination, the Global Methodist Church. United Methodist Churches wishing to join this new denomination can use the "disaffiliation plan" approved at the 2019 Called General Conference to leave the United Methodist Church.

The majority of the United Methodist Church in the United States, is trying to move forward in a graceful way to be more inclusive and yet provide room for a variety of beliefs about human sexuality. This is a conversation we at Main Street United Methodist Church need to have, so we have decided to meet in neighborhood groups. This will be a time of "Dialogue & Dessert." The detailed schedule for these meetings is on pages 2 and 6 of the newsletter and on the table in the Atrium. Please come prepared to have open and honest conversation. If you have questions, please send them to me in advance so I have an opportunity to prepare properly for them. As I conclude I remember Paul's words in Ephesians 4:1-6, I therefore, the prisoner in the Lord, beg you to lead a life worthy of the calling to which you have been called, with all humility and gentleness, with patience, bearing with one another in love, making every effort to maintain the unity of the Spirit in the bond of peace. There is one body and one Spirit, just as you were called to the one hope of your calling, one Lord, one faith, one baptism, one God and Father of all, who is above all and through all and in all.



# CHURCH FAMILY

There are no words that even come close to expressing how I feel. The one that I keep saying over and over is "WOW!" Perhaps **WOW** can be an acronym for "With Overwhelming Wonder!" because I am absolutely in awe of all you have done for me. The beautiful cards, emails, calls and one-on-one conversations...the amazing Pentecost worship service... the delicious and magnificently decorated luncheon with so many of you there to share it with me...the resolutions that are so kind and humbling...the very touching words that were spoken and the songs sung during both worship and the luncheon that were so beautiful and meaningful...and the absolutely incredible gifts!!!! I pray that God through the power of the Holy Spirit will reach down and light the fire of God's love in your hearts in ways that you could never imagine!
