

I remember well the births of all three of my children. I remember what I was doing the day of their birth from the very beginning of the day to the wee hours of the next morning. Such an amazing experience! It is hard to describe the joy and wonder I felt upon holding that new life for the first time. Colleen and I had prepared for each of our children in special ways. From picking the "perfect" name to preparing their new room with the right colors and wall hangings. All of these things are special and important when preparing for the coming of a new child. However, in the busyness of preparing and the shock of knowing you are now responsible for another life, we often miss the fact that this is an incredible miracle. No matter one's place in life,

from the poorest to the richest, a new child is a miracle of God and a reminder of God's love! This has been the case from the very beginning of time. In our world of cell phones and social media, the birth of a child is often announced and made known to hundreds and sometimes thousands of people within a few hours of the birth. This was not the case in first century Palestine.

In first century Palestine, at the birth of a child, I'm sure there was celebration in the village where the child was born; but beyond that, it most likely went unnoticed. That was the same for Jesus' birth. There were no Facebook posts or Twitter threads sharing the news that Jesus, the son of Mary and Joseph, had been born. There was, however, a band of angels who announced the birth to a

group of lowly shepherds in the field. This birth was made known in several ways because it was the most unusual and special birth to ever occur. Why? It was the Incarnation! What do we mean when say this? "It comes from a Latin word meaning 'embodiment' or 'become flesh.' The doctrine of the Incarnation represents one of the foundational, and some might say scandalous, claims of the Christian faith: namely, that the God who created all that is, who sustains the universe by his power, came to us in Jesus. He did not simply inspire Jesus, or speak through Jesus as he might inspire and speak through people today. No, Incarnation claims that God actually became flesh in Jesus." This is the way Adam Hamilton explains it in his book, Incarnation: Rediscovering the Significance of Christmas.

We will study this book together through the season of Advent. It will also help inform our time of worship during the four Sundays of Advent. Understanding and discovering the meaning of the Incarnation will make it impossible for us to lose sight of what Christmas really means from a faith perspective. Christmas will for sure be different this year because of COVID, but the meaning of Christmas is never changed by our circumstances. The Incarnation brings grace, forgiveness, and new life into every situation we may find ourselves in. Thanks be to God that God visited us in the baby Jesus. Now that is a birth to remember!

- Volunteers for registration, ushers, greeters


