However, there is a guide for our life of faith. From this guide, the Scriptures, we can formulate a blueprint for discipleship. John Wesley created a simple "blueprint" for the earlier people called Methodist.

As 2020 begins, we will start a new Bible/book study on <u>Wesley's</u>

<u>General Rules as a Guide for</u> <u>Christian Living: A Blueprint for</u> <u>Discipleship.</u> In this 6-week study, we will look at these general rules and the scriptural foundations Wesley used for the formation of the rules. We will talk about how we can apply them to our lives, and how we can live more fully into the will of God for our lives and the life of our community.

As we start a new year, let's make a commitment to study the blueprints and build beautiful lives that can withstand the storms that are always a part of our life journey. Please, let's make this journey together. The study will begin January 9 and go through February 13. It will meet on Thursday nights at 6:30 and if you like, join us from 5:30 – 6:30 for a light meal. I look forward to seeing you then.
