

Simon Peter answered,
"YOU ARE THE MESSIAH,
THE SON OF THE LIVING GOD."

In August I have been preaching from the Gospel of Matthew, and we have reach a critical point in the Gospel. The climax of the Gospel happens in chapter 16 as Peter declares Jesus as the "Messiah, the Son of the living God." As the disciples worked their way through those days, they were not sure what the future held. However, with Peter's declaration, they were sure who held the future. It is Jesus, the Messiah, the Son of the living God. They continued to follow Jesus even when they were not sure what was next. The disciples were not perfect, but they had faith enough to follow Jesus.

Since March 2020, things have been very different for our world, our nation, our communities, and our church. In the midst of this global pandemic, the church universal has changed in the way we gather and worship; but the One we worship has not changed.

Jesus is still "the Messiah, the Son of God," God is still Love, and the Holy Spirit is still the eternal presence of the divine in our lives.

At Main Street UMC, we have been back to in-person worship since June 28, 2020. Our 8:30 am in-person worship has been a blessing. As we have gathered, I have been blessed and encouraged by your attendance. It also gives me hope that we are working our way back to some sense of normalcy.

joy that we announce the return of our Scouting ministries and AA gatherings. There will be restrictions for these groups, and certain areas of the facilities will not be available for use; but there is great hope in a return to a "new normal."

As we continue to follow Jesus as best we can and live in a constantly changing world, we must remember to declare as Peter did, Jesus is "the Messiah, the Son of the living God." This not only guides us in a changing world, it will also guide us in the changes that occur in our personal lives. Thank you for all the wonderful cards and prayers offered up for my healing. I find strength and hope in your prayers and words of encouragement. I hope to be back to my "new normal" very soon.

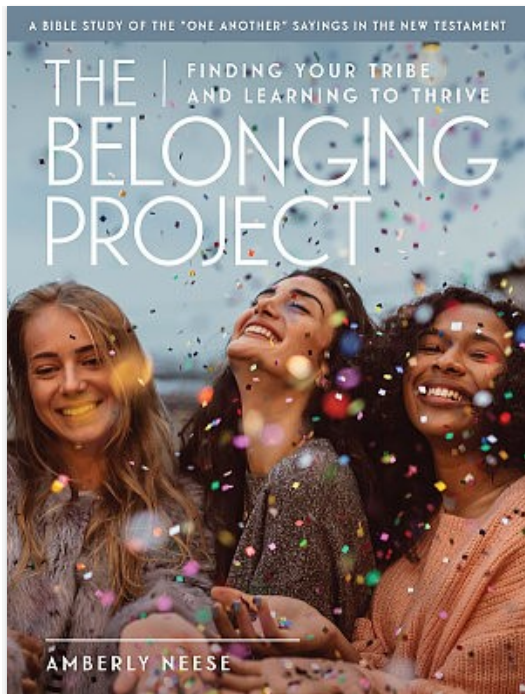

- Forgive one another

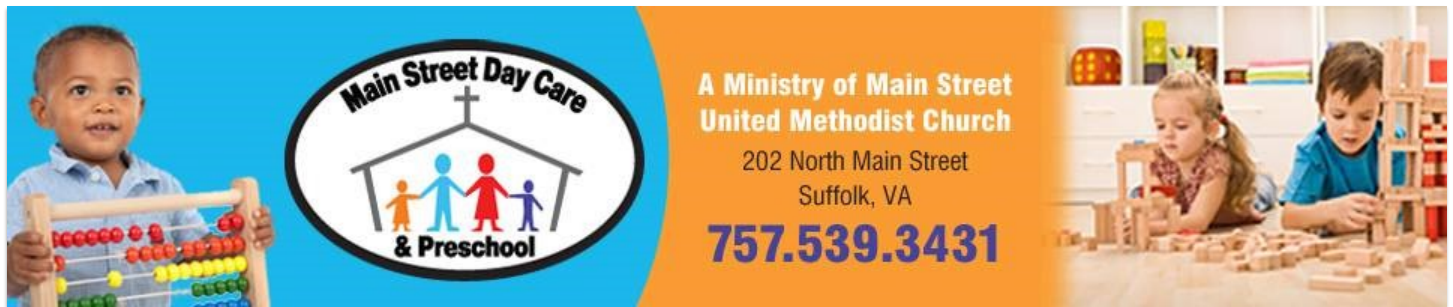
[FOR CHILDREN]

Crafts will be provided for children for all 4 weeks prior to the first session, and we will complete crafts together while on Zoom.

WHAT'S HAPPING AT MAIN STREET DAY CARE & PRESCHOOL



These past months we have been working hard in partnership with local agencies, our Board of Directors, and Conference leaders of the Virginia United Methodist Church for the health and safety of MSDC's children, families, and staff. This partnership continues with parents and guardians in helping keep the children, families, and staff healthy and safe.

When the shutdowns around the world began, our Day Care director, Julia Farmer, and Board of Directors decided it was in the best interest of the children and staff to shut down until more direction could be given on how to respond to the virus. The doors were closed for 4 weeks, and then

the need to provide childcare for essential employees became a priority. Policies for safely returning children and staff to the building were carefully developed and implemented, and soon we were back in business. With reduced numbers of children allowed in each classroom and many other changes, children of essential employees were the first to return. As we entered Phase 2, more children have been able to come back. With the help of a PPP grant and another from the state, salaries have been covered. With lower numbers of children, the tuition income was greatly reduced.

Today MSDC continues to operate with the safety of children and

staff at the forefront. This fall we will also provide care for up to 20 school age children who will not be returning to the classroom. They will be able to do their work virtually with the assistance of the staff. In addition, we will provide appropriate activities as we do with the summer camp for older children.

Main Street Day Care and Preschool has been operating for 32 years, and we are glad to have weathered the Covid-19 storm so far. We will continue to do all that we can to serve the community through this ministry. Please pray for our staff and children and the parents who depend on us to care for their children so that they can return to work.

TROOP 1 SEA BASE 2020



Five Troop 1 Boy Scouts (Joseph Askew, Braedon McCauley, Devin Wilson, Matthew Shaffer, Matthew Duley) and two leaders (David Askew and Rick Wilson) have completed the Boy Scout Triple Crown of high adventure bases in the last 13 months (Northern Tier, Philmont and Sea Base).

Boy Scouts of America purchased the complex in 1979 with a grant, and the Florida Gateway to High Adventure had a new home and a new name – the Florida National High Adventure Sea Base. Since 1980, the BSA has added participant dorms housing over 200 Scouts and leaders, scuba pools, conference/staff housing, program facilities and an administration building, making this facility a showplace of Scouting!
