Hygiene Kit Materials

- One hand towel (15 x 25 –17 x 27 inches)
- No kitchen, cleaning, or microfiber towels
- One (1) washcloth
- No kitchen, cleaning, or microfiber towels
- One (1) comb
- Must be sturdy with at least 6 inches of teeth
- No pocket combs or picks
- Rattail and combs without handles are acceptable but must have at least 6 inches of teeth
- One toenail or fingernail clipper
- No emery boards or metal nail files
 Bath-size soap (3 oz. bar or larger)
- No Ivory or Jergen's soap
- Do not remove from packaging
 One adult toothbrush

- · Do not remove from packaging
- Personal advertising not acceptable 10 adhesive bandages (¾ by 3 inches)
- Common household bandages acceptable

One one-gallon size re-sealable bag
Assembly Directions

- Lay hand towel flat on a table.
- Lay the washcloth in the center of the hand towel.
- Place all remaining items on top of the washcloth (except the plastic bag).
- Fold the sides of the hand towel to cover the items.
- Grasp the bundle tightly and roll over the remainder of the towel.
 Place the tightly rolled bundle in the plastic bag, remove air, and seal.

Important Notes

- · All items must be new.
- Do not wash any of the items as they will no longer be considered new.
- Do not include any personal notes, money or additional materials in the kits. Contents of kits or the containers of kits should not be imprinted with cartoon characters, advertisements, religious, patriotic, military or camouflage symbols.

LORNA SLAUGHTER, EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR, SUFFOLK CHRISTIAN FELLOWSHIP CENTER TO PRESENT THE MAIN STREET MISSION MOMENT ON SUNDAY, MAY 5, 2019

Main Street will hold a "Noisy Offering" on May 5 to be used to purchase pallets of food from the food bank to be distributed by the SCFC.

The Suffolk Christian Fellowship Center (SCFC), a non-profit 501c3 organization, is an outreach ministry under the auspices of Suffolk Christian Fellowship Ministry led by Pastor Ralph L. Slaughter. His wife, Lorna, is the Executive Director of the Center that is one of the city's busiest Outreach Centers offering free groceries, meals, clothing, household goods, and resources to anyone who comes for help. Located in the heart of downtown at 211 E. Washington Street, the Center is surrounded by low-income neighborhoods and subsidized senior housing—exactly where it is needed the most. More than just meals, the Center provides a warm and welcoming family atmosphere where everyone is treated with respect, encouraged to find the support they need, and given the opportunity to share what they can with others.

SCFC feeds a minimum 300 families per month, going through a minimum of about 35 thousand pounds of food every month, or about 400+ thousand pounds of food each year. The Outreach Center provided those guests with hot meals, groceries, clothing, and household items.

Vision: We envision a community where everyone has food security via access to nutritious food; and our community is educated, enlightened, and empowered with the issues of poverty.

Values: We believe that access to nutritious food is a basic human right. We are committed to responding to the needs of our community through food distribution and support services.

Our History

Our initial program began with the hosting of a Soup Kitchen that we held every Sunday. We chose to do this on a Sunday because traditionally this is the day when family and friends gather together to fellowship with one another. We believe in this tradition and therefore maintained this day to give those who did not have family or friends an opportunity to fellowship with us. Having this opportunity to meet people of all ages and walks of life we were able to determine this one truth: For many people the belief about hunger is that it is confined to specific pockets of society, certain areas of the country or certain neighborhoods, but the reality is very different. Although we

are diverse in many ways; our basic needs are all the same.

With an all volunteer staff we have been providing meals to homeless & low-income families for the past 17 years.

In 2004 we became partners with the Foodbank of Southeastern Virginia in Norfolk and Operation Blessing in 2017. With these partnerships and many others we were able to expand our current <u>Supplemental Source</u> outreach programs to now include:

- 1) Soup Kitchen 2) Emergency Food Pantry 3) Food Rescue Program
- 4) Charity Closet 5) Clean Living Store
- **6)** 2 Your Front Door **7)** Baby Block
- 8) Co-Op Program

We now have more space which has fostered our ability to offer more programs and services that provide food security as well as educate, enlighten and empower our community about poverty and how we can minimize the weight it places on our community. However, with donations over the past year decreasing and food assistance requests increasing, we find ourselves in need of major support to meet the demands of providing these resources for Suffolk's food insecure.
