Greetings in the name of the Lord Jesus Christ!


As I reflect on the sacred writings we call scripture, I'm amazed at the breadth and width of human emotions. It is throughout all of scripture, but it is especially clear in the Psalms—from the brokenness of King David in Psalm 51 where he knows his sin is ever before him (Psalm 51:3) to the joy of those who do not follow the advice of the wicked but delight in the law of the Lord (Psalm 1:1-2). In many places, the perceived distance of Yahweh leads to laments that can still bring tears to my eyes. But there are also Psalms that lead us to respond to God's goodness.

During the last quarter of the church year, we will focus on God's goodness and our response to that goodness. Psalm 116:12 asks the question, "What shall I return to the Lord for all his goodness to me?" The Psalmist then answers his own question by saying, "I will lift up the cup of salvation and call on the name of the Lord."

During the month of October, we will look at how we "lift up the cup of salvation" and how we acknowledge God's goodness in our lives. We will look at the small steps we take that lead us to making bigger movements of faith (Luke 17:5-10). We will also consider the power of thankfulness and gratitude (Luke 17:11-19). As we continue to reflect on God's goodness, we will consider the importance of being persistent in the small and big things of our faith (Luke 18:1-8). And finally, on October 27, we will look at the two options Jesus provides and decide how we will let God use us to further the work of God's Kingdom. On this Sunday we will use our "Response Cards" to make our financial commitments as one of the ways we respond to God's goodness in our lives.

Main Street UMC is a wonderfully faithful community of people who respond generously in so many ways to God's goodness. It has been a pleasure watching the way God has used and will continue to use the many resources you bring. Thank you for your faithfulness, and may we continue to take the small steps that lead to the giant leaps of faith.



All Saints Sunday, to be commemorated on November 3, allows us an opportunity to remember those Saints who have passed on, but whose presence and participation in the history of Main Street Church left a legacy for which we are thankful. Within the Main Street Chapel, located behind the Sanctuary, is a special place of remembrance. The Memorial Wall contains plaques that will be engraved with the names and dates of birth and death of church members, former pastors, and their immediate family members. If those persons have been buried or cremated and their remains rest elsewhere, this Memorial Wall provides an opportunity to remember that Saint within the church they loved and supported.

If you are interested in this opportunity of remembrance, there is a packet of information available in the church office. Each memorial wall plaque, which may have as many as two named persons who share the same surname on each plaque, will cost \$500.
