Each of us has the opportunity to fast weekly and to pray daily with the Council of Bishops in preparation for the Called General Conference in February, 2019. After you read this article, please turn to The Main Thing at Main Street on the back page for further information.

In 2016 at the United Methodist General Conference, a 428-405 vote, authorized the Bishops to form a commission to help them avoid a denominational breakup over homosexuality.

From January 2017 until May 2018, the 32-member **Commission on a Way Forward** met almost monthly and received periodic feedback from the Council of Bishops. Three bishops served as commission moderators facilitating discussion. Serving as commission members were equal numbers of laity and clergy (geographically and age diverse) and nine bishops from all over the world. Finding common ground is no easy task in a denomination whose 12.5 million-membership stretches from countries where same-gender marriage is legal to countries where same-gender activity is a crime.

In the Virginia Conference, Bishop Lewis held "Chat and Chew" gatherings across the Districts for discussion among lay people and clergy. Main Street UMC was asked to attend February 17, 2018, shortly after Pastor Myrtle's death.

What is the debate over? At present, the United Methodist Church's **official stances on homosexuality** declare the practice of homosexuality "incompatible with Christian teaching, "prohibit clergy from officiating at same-gender unions" and preclude the ordination of "self-avowed, practicing" gay clergy. (Book of Discipline, para 304.3) However, some pastors and conferences have been defying these prohibitions. (This is not the first time in church history that "civil disobedience" has been used to advocate for changes in Church doctrine and polity.)

The Commission presented three possible models:

- Traditionalist plan would maintain the denomination's restrictions and put greater emphasis on enforcement.
- One-Church model would remove current restrictions and leave questions of ordination and marriage closer to the conference and local-church levels. (not fully fleshed out yet.)
- Multi-branch model would allow conferences to choose among three connectional conferences for affiliation. The
 connectional conferences would align based on theology or perspective on LGBTQ ministry be it traditionalist,
 progressive or allowing for a variety of approaches. This plan would require multiple amendments to the
 denomination's constitution.

On May 4, 2018 the Bishops recommended the **One Church model** but it was not unanimous. The plan would remove the restrictive language against the practice of homosexuality in the Book of Discipline, the denomination's policy book. The plan also adds assurances to pastors and conferences who in good conscience cannot perform same-sex weddings or ordain "self-avowed practicing" gay clergy that they don't have to do so. Central conferences — church regions in Africa, Asia and Europe — could maintain current restrictions. All three plans will be submitted to the Called General Conference in February, 2019. Delegates to the 2019 General Conference are the ones who attended in 2016. Full details of the plans will be available by July 8, 2018.

This year Main Street UMC will assemble **Health Kits** that will be taken to Annual Conference in June. Below are the specific instructions for each kit. Please follow these directions.

HEALTH KITS: Place the items in a 1 gallon Zip-lock bag

- 1 hand towel (15" x 25" up to 17" x 27", no kitchen towels)
- 1 washcloth
- 1 comb (sturdy and longer than 6", not pocket-sized)
- 1 metal nail file or fingernail clippers (no emery boards or toenail clippers)
- 1 bath-sized bar of soap (3 oz. & up); no Ivory or Jergens
- 6 adhesive plastic strip sterile bandages, 3/4-1" (Band-Aids)
- Enclose \$1.00 to purchase toothpaste (do not buy toothpaste) & to ship the kit

Please bring your assembled bags to the church on or before **June 4**. They will be delivered to Annual Conference on June 15.

THE MAIN THING AT MAIN STREET... FINDING THE WAY FORWARD

Main Street is working on its way forward to receive Rich Meiser as the new pastor on July 1. Our way forward includes strengthening our communications, our Council on Ministries, and working together to be the church we are called to be in Suffolk and in the world.

But, as indicated in another article of the Messenger, there is another movement called "The Way Forward," in the United Methodist Church. (See page 2)

The issues involved strike fear in our hearts and tug at our understandings and misunderstandings of Scripture and of humanity. If we can take a breath, and truly listen to each other before offering our own opinions, we have a great opportunity to grow deeper in our faith. I hope you will read the plans to be submitted to General Conference with curiosity, questions and an open mind. Also, I hope you will think deeply about your own opinions and feelings and what data you use to support them. And I ask you to join all United Methodists through the Upper Room ministries to pray beginning June 3. UMCPrays.org.

All United Methodists are invited to:

- Engage in a weekly Wesleyan 24-hour fast from Thursday after dinner to Friday mid-afternoon. Those who have health situations causing food fasts to be unadvisable might consider fasting from social media, emails or another daily activity.
- Pause and pray for our church's mission and way forward daily

for four minutes from 2:23 through 2:26 a.m. or p.m. This is because the Special Session of General Conference will be held February 23 through February 26, 2019.

 Pray using a weekly prayer calendar that will be posted on the UMCPrays.org website from June 2, 2018, through the end of February 2019. The calendar will list a unique cluster of names each week. It will also include Commission on a Way Forward members, the Commission of the General Conference and the staff of the General Conference.

My fear is that this issue will take over and keep the church from doing what Christ has called us to do, to make disciples of Jesus Christ for the transformation of the world. Jesus does not address the issue. But Jesus does address the issues of: who is our neighbor? our use of money, our anxiety and fear, and our trust and faith in Him.

When Jesus was asked what is the most important commandment of the Jewish Law, Jesus responded, "To love the Lord your God with all your heart, with all your soul, and with all your mind...The second is to love your neighbor as yourself. All the law and the prophets hang on these 2 Commandments." (Matthew 22:36-40)

In parting, I ask you to spend your energy, your assets and your love where Jesus directs.
