This year Main Street UMC will assemble Health Kits that will be taken to Annual Conference in June. Below are the specific instructions for each kit. Please follow these directions. You may bring your finished kits to the office by June 4. Our goal - 50 kits!

HEALTH KITS: Place the items in a 1 gallon Zip-lock bag

- 1 hand towel (15" x 25" up to 17" x 27", no kitchen towels)
- 1 washcloth
- 1 comb (sturdy and longer than 6", not pocket-sized)
- 1 metal nail file or fingernail clippers (no emery boards or toenail clippers)
- 1 bath-sized bar of soap (3 oz. & up); no Ivory or Jergens

- 6 adhesive plastic strip sterile bandages, 3/4-1" (Band-Aids)
- Enclose \$2.00 to purchase toothpaste (do not buy toothpaste) & to ship the kit

Please bring your assembled bags to the church on or before June 4. They will be delivered to Annual Conference on June 15.

THE MAIN THING AT MAIN STREET...

The Main Thing at Main Street in May is Missions! What is our mission anyway? The mission, the purpose, of the United Methodist Church, from our Book of Discipline is to make disciples of Jesus Christ for the transformation of the world. How do we do that? The Discipline goes on to state: We proclaim the good news of God's grace and by exemplifying Jesus' command to love God and neighbor, thus seeking the fulfillment of God's reign and realm in the world.

So, this is not just about saving ourselves, by professing Jesus Christ as our Lord and Savior, but responding in gratitude to what God through Christ has given to us. Mission requires us to move beyond ourselves in whatever way we are able to transform the world.

John's vision in the Book of Revelation 21 is the Holy City coming down out of heaven from God, because God wants to live among us! - "The home of God is among mortals!" This is extraordinary! So if God is going to move in among us, what

kinds of preparation will we make?

If I prepare for a guest at my house, "crisis cleaning" occurs. Things that I have not touched for weeks (probably months) find a new place. The grass is mowed, the house is vacuumed and space is remodeled and set aside for my guest. Then I provide myself as a listening ear and a willing participant in things in which my guests are interested. I usually do a little research in their interests so that I am able to assist as a guide.

If God the Father, Jesus the Son, or the Holy Spirit moves in, then how will you interpret your life and your work? I would like to be able to say "I am on a mission

for you! I am following your directions to go into all the world to preach the Gospel! I preach the Gospel with words as a last resort, but everywhere I can, through love and action. I dedicate my time and resources so that everyone will know your love and experience your saving grace. You know, I enjoy providing ways for people to meet you in their everyday lives."

For me, this is what mission is all aboutglorifying God by providing for people's basic needs of food, water and shelter; glorifying God by providing justice in a world that increasingly glorifies greed and injustice; and by glorifying God by being a mentor and a guide. (Micah 6:8)
