Ellen Comstock will be available to cover for pastoral emergencies and to preach several Sundays during this time. You may remember that Ellen was interim pastor between Pastor

Myrtle and myself. I covet your prayers during these next several weeks and look forward to the time I will be able to be fully present again.

As I have read Matthew's gospel several times over these past few weeks, I'm convinced that Jesus calls us to an abundant life. At the end of chapter 11, Jesus offers one of the most reassuring and comforting invitations I have ever received. Matt. 11:28-30 "Come to me, all you that are weary and carrying heavy burdens, and I will give you rest. Take my yoke upon you, and learn from me; for I am gentle and humble in heart, and you will find rest for your souls. For my yoke is easy, and my burden is light." When we turn to Jesus we can find rest for our souls, even in the midst of a pandemic, social unrest, and personal angst.

Jesus teaches us in Matthew 25 that whatever we do for the least of these, we have done for him. This year's confirmation class (Jackson Henry, Michael McPherson, Gracie Finn Eure, Buddy Baker), Pastor Rich, and our intern Meredith Webb discussed this lesson when they gathered for a day of service on Saturday the 18th of July. Our confirmands discussed who were "the least of these" and why it is important to care for them and show them the love of Christ. A little compassion can go a long way, and during this pandemic we have seen outpourings of compassion as well as times when we could have used a little more. The Confirmation Class helped Main Street show even more compassion for our community members who may be experiencing homelessness or facing a tough situation right now. The Confirmation Class packaged 25 care packages to be stored at the church that will be handed out at the church staff's discretion to

those who may seek help from the church. The confirmands helped to choose and shop for the supplies for these care packages as well as sort and package everything. Included in each care package, is a bottle of water, a small sack, a gift card to a local fast food restaurant, socks, a face mask, travel sizes of hand sanitizer, mouthwash, and deodorant, and a list of local resources that people can go to for further assistance. The group had to go to several

different places to hunt down all the supplies they needed but they did so with joy, patience and compassion. Thanks to the confirmation class of 2020, Main Street will be able to serve our community in a new way!

because there were just three of us; including myself, our youth Kate Holland, and our leader Mark Popik. We got to spend intentional, quality time with one another and enjoy a few days of service and each other's company.

REACH is currently flipping two houses in downtown Roanoke with the hope of them becoming a home for families to live in and also have some extra space to rent. We had the opportunity to learn a lot about the project and work on it a bit ourselves! We spackled and sanded spots on the walls and ceilings that needed some TLC as well as priming and painting the ceiling in one of the bathrooms. Where I believe God really used us as his hands and feet that week, however, was at the Christian Soldiers Food Bank. I remember serving there in 2013 when I first went to Roanoke. Back then it was all about the people we were serving, but this time it was about the people who

volunteer countless days and hours to make sure those who are hungry are fed. As we sorted through produce, we learned that some volunteers had been working there four days a week, every week for 20 years. As we packaged food to be sent out to people waiting in line, stories of times when the volunteers themselves stood in line were shared; and it become obvious that there is a deep sense of gratitude for this place among the volunteers. As we lugged heavy boxes and sorted through even more food, we learned that these volunteers were family and they tease, and laugh, and love each other. It is a well-oiled machine that is vital to the livelihood of thousands of people every month, and we were blessed to have been a part of it even just for a short time.

In the evenings, we filled our time with fun and food. We enjoyed cooking together, watching movies, playing Monopoly, going to the Mill Mountain Star, and riding scooters through downtown Roanoke. On our last night, our host Tim Dayton came and shared a sacred REACH tradition in which you are challenged to use your eyes, ears, mouth, and hands to serve humbly and embody Christ's love. This is not an easy challenge, yet it is one that was accepted by our small team of three in a unique time and place where we experienced God in a big way.
